<b>MUST DO</b>	<u>Every</u> kindergarten student (both half day and all day) should be doing the <b>MUST DO</b> yellow assignments and submitting the assignments that are yellow and bolded in the <a href="#">Kindergarten Assignment Submission Link</a> on a daily basis.

<p><b>CAN DO</b></p> <p><b>ALL DAY KINDERGARTEN</b></p> <p><b>JUST FOR FUN</b></p>	<p>All kindergarteners are encouraged to do the <b>CAN DO</b> assignments, but they are not required. They are there for extra practice and fun.</p> <p>All day kindergarteners are encouraged to do the <b>ALL DAY KINDERGARTEN</b> assignments (developed for the all day kindergarteners), but they are not required. Half day kinders are welcome to do these assignments as extension and challenge work if they choose to, but again, these are not required.</p> <p>The orange <b>JUST FOR FUN</b> section (at the very bottom of the lesson) is not an assignment, but rather cool things we found that your child might enjoy doing.</p>
<p>ELA-Reading</p>	<p><a href="#">Today's Welcome Video - Mrs. Dow</a>  <a href="#">Today's Welcome Video- Mrs. Tomlinson</a></p> <p>Have your student listen to the attached read aloud, <a href="#">The Very Grouchy Ladybug</a>. By Eric Carle.</p> <p>Discuss with your student what is the meaning of grouchy? What does it look like? Have you ever been grouchy? If so when? How do you feel when you are grouchy? How do you think others feel when you are grouchy to them?</p> <p>Students will work in Lexia for 20-25 minutes. Lexia can be accessed through <a href="#">Clever</a>. Here are directions on how to <a href="#">access Clever</a>.</p>
<p>ELA-Writing</p>	<p>Have your student watch <a href="#">this video</a> and write their lowercase letters (they will need two pieces of paper and a pencil) as I dictate them.</p> <p><b>For the kindergarten submission assignment today, take and submit a picture from the dictation they wrote from the video above and submit it in the link below. The students need to do this work by themselves. Do not correct misformed letters - we want to see what they can do without support. <p>Math</p>	<p>Students will watch this <a href="#">Eureka Math Lesson 5.9</a></p> <p>Students will watch the video lesson using paper/pencil or white board/marker to follow along. Throughout the video, have your</p>

	<p>student draw a picture to match the problems. You may have to sit with your students and press pause while they write and solve the 3 problems in the video. At the end of the lesson there is an Exit Ticket. Have your student complete it, totalling 4 video problems. Talk about the 3 different ways to draw the problems.</p> <p>For extra practice draw stars and circle 10 ones and some more ones to show each number below: 18, 20, 13. Now you choose a teen number to draw in the 5 group way.</p> <p>Students will work in Zearn for 10 minutes today. Zearn can be accessed through <a href="#">Clever</a>. The Zearn app is the yellow square with the blue/white letter Z. This is a fun and easy to use program kinders are now able to use to practice the math skills we are learning..</p>
Science/Social Studies/Large & Fine Motor Skills	<p>Video- <a href="#">The Stunning Life Cycle of a Ladybug</a>. I find it interesting that when the ladybug hatches out of the pupa, it has no dots!</p> <p>Can you draw the life cycle of a ladybug? Don't forget to label it, just like you did the butterfly life cycle. Is it the same as the butterfly? Talk with an adult on how it is the same or different than a butterfly.</p>
